Dear Everyone,

I hope you are continuing to enjoy the sunshine. Don't forget we have Forest Church this Saturday, 1st May, in Bulphan Churchyard at 4pm. Please remember to bring something to sit on, either a picnic blanket or a chair and make sure you wear warm clothes and bring a waterproof in case it rains. And we have our United Benefice

Service, All Together Service, at Bulphan Church on Sunday at 10am. There is no need to book for Forest Church as it is outside, but please could you let me know if you are planning to come to the United Benefice Service on Sunday.

On Bank Holiday Monday the driveway sale is being held in Bulphan from 12.00 until 4pm, where we have a stall, outside the Church, to raise money for the Benefice. The stall will be selling secondhand books, cards, face masks and some jigsaws. Thank you to those who have brought books to sell and to those who have offered to help on the day. There will be many stalls around Bulphan, so do pop along to support this if you are able.

I would like to encourage you to attend our online SHAPE Course which is now beginning on Thursday 13th May at 8pm not on 6th May as originally planned. More details can be found later in the notice sheet. Do let me know if you would like to be part of this.

As you know all three churches are working towards an Ecochurch award. Bronze, silver and gold awards are presented to churches for environmental attainment across a wide range of areas, including care of buildings and churchyards, energy-saving, recycling, food and lifestyle, worship, preaching and teaching, engagement in communities and the wider world. Each week we will be including an 'Eco Pause for Thought' on our notice sheet, if you have any suggestions for this piece please let Lynda know.

Thank you, also, for your continued support of the foodbank. Yesterday, in their weekly bulletin, it said that the last year has been unprecedented, with a huge increase in the need for food banks. Between 1 April 2020 and 31 March 2021, food banks in the Trussell Trust's network distributed 2.5 million emergency food parcels to people in crisis, a 33% increase on the previous year. Almost a million of these went to children – that's almost two parcels every minute. Compared to this time five years ago, the food banks in the Trussell Trust network are providing 128% more emergency food parcels.

At the end of the last financial year, our local foodbank saw an increase of 25% in referrals. Last year they fed 8,414 people, 3770 of whom were children. 75,726 meals were provided for people referred to the foodbank in crisis; a year on year increase of over 15,000 meals. And the foodbank has not only supported all those referred to us in crisis but have also been empowered to support other organisations supporting people in need across Thurrock. Hunger in the UK isn't about food. It's about a lack of income. The main reasons people need emergency food are:

emergency food are:

- Problems with the benefits system (delays, inadequacy and reductions)
- Challenging life experiences or ill-health
- Lack of informal support

As some of us are only too painfully aware, it can happen to anyone, articulated in the words of the poem, 'No Shame, No Stigma,' which you can listen by going to <u>Share the poem - The Trussell Trust</u>. You may like to share it with others.

As we take seriously our Christian responsibility to care for our brothers and sisters, let's continue to work together to build a more just, more compassionate future.


