Dear Everyone,

Since returning from holiday and, following the Government's recent announcements on the lifting of Covid restrictions, I have now had a chance to meet with all three PCCs, and have consulted with clergy colleagues, to discuss the best way forward with services in church. Having taken into consideration the many thoughts, views and concerns expressed, below is what, after prayer and reflection, I consider to be the most appropriate outworking of those deliberations. Please be assured that I will continue to review this regularly, in conjunction with keeping an eye on the local Covid Figures.

- Masks: People are encouraged to wear masks. Masks should be worn for singing until further notice.
- Singing: The 8.45am Service will remain a said service with no singing. Those who would prefer not to sing are
 encouraged to attend this service. The 10am Service will be a service with singing and those singing will need to wear a
 mask.
- Social Distancing: Orsett and Bulphan Churches have retained markings for social distancing, with distance reduced at Bulphan to allow for more people to attend. Horndon Church have removed social distance markings and request that individuals are sensitive to the needs of others. All three church systems allow for both those who wish to sit apart from others and those who wish to sit with friends. If you have a particular requirement, please speak with a warden or sides-person on arrival at church.
- Refreshments: Refreshments can be served after all 10am services.
- Holy Communion: Holy Communion will continue to be received in one kind until further notice.
- Sanitiser: Gel will be available at all three churches.
- Track and Trace: The QR codes will be displayed at all three churches, but it is no longer mandatory to sign in.
- **Ventilation:** As much ventilation as possible will be provided.
- Children's Activities: Children's activities can take place.

The above amendments have been made prayerfully and represent what, I hope, is a positive move towards more active worship. I recognise that these developments will be received in a number of different ways, but please could I ask you all for your patience and understanding as we negotiate our way forward together. Each person is known and loved individually by God and we are all called to be responsible to and for one another, respecting the more vulnerable whose suffering is our suffering. (1 Corinthians 12: 12-27).

On another note, don't forget that Forest Church will be held this Saturday, 7th August, at Orsett Church, at 4pm. Do come along if you are able and make sure you remember to bring something to sit on and waterproofs in case it

Please be assured of my prayers for you all and please could I ask for your prayers for me and for Max at this time and, particularly, for Moji who is due to be ordained on September 11th at Chelmsford Cathedral, marking the beginning of her curacy here in this Benefice.

Christmas Shoeboxes appeal 2021

The United Benefice of Orsett, Bulphan and Horndon-on-the-Hill churches has once again registered to support the Link to Hope Christmas shoebox appeal. Orsett, Bulphan and Horndon-on-the-Hill Primary Schools are also supporting this charity.



If you would like to fill a shoebox please look at www.linktohope.co.uk to find out how to pack a box, what you need to include and you can download a label for your box. In September there will be leaflets in church for those people without printers at home. One important thing is the charity asks that we use regular size shoeboxes to make packing in their lorries easier. Details about collection dates will be sent out in September.

There are two options

The **Family Shoeboxes** of gifts are given to families who often have to make a choice between buying food or fuel at Christmas time – buying presents is just not a priority. Many of these families do not have running water, heating or electricity. Some live in appalling conditions, often living in just one or two rooms, and life for them is a real struggle to survive.

A shoebox for a family means that everyone receives a gift. A scarf for the mum, a tape measure for the dad, toys and games for the children as well as stationery and coloured pens. Also toiletries, toothpaste, shampoo and soap to keep everyone clean and free from the germs that make them ill. And of course sweets and chocolates for everyone – a family favourite.

Due to the number of elderly people that are now being left alone due to their families leaving to work away, they have launched the **Elderly Shoebox Appeal**. The boxes are similar however the children's games and education materials are replaced with a wind up torch, sensory items, candle and holder etc.



Boxes get sent to **Romania, Bulgaria, Moldova and Ukraine. The charity is** small enough that they have a personal relationship with all the key contacts in Eastern Europe who distribute your Shoeboxes and we do spot checks to ensure that your boxes are received by the correct people. Ink to Hope is **Christian charity** who believe in distributing love to those in need regardless of background, colour, creed or religion.



Eco Tip - Helping birds and other wildlife in hot weather.

Keeping your bird bath topped up with fresh water in warmer weather can be a life saver for our feathered friends. Get your garden birds through a heatwave when natural supplies, like worms, become scarce, by putting out supplementary food - black sunflower seeds, pinhead oatmeal, soaked sultanas, raisins and currants, mealworms, waxworms and good seed mixture.

Ensure garden ponds always have ways for hedgehogs (and other small mammals) to climb out if they fall in. You could even create a make-shift pond from a washing-up bowl. Hedgehogs particularly need help in a heatwave, as their usual prey of slugs, snails and worms are often unavailable. Leaving out a juicy snack, such as mealworms or canned dog food, can help in sustained warm weather.
