Dear Everyone,

After the notices were produced last week we heard of the sad death of Sir David Amess, who was brutally murdered in Leigh-on-Sea. Although, he didn't serve in Thurrock, several of our church members had met with Sir David in a variety of contexts. Archbishop Stephen, who grew up in Leigh-on-Sea and knew Sir David well, through his time as Bishop of Chelmsford, said,

"He was—and I know this from the work I did with him—a deeply committed constituency MP. He exemplified what that means.....it was Sir David's love and faith in Christ that underpinned his vision and values, and enabled him to reach across party-political divides, get on well with everyone and exhibit a good-humoured generosity and a kindness that is, sadly, often woefully lacking in public and political discourse today...

It is because Sir David Amess so exemplified those things, regardless of what his politics happened to be, that we are so easily able to come together and remember him, to esteem his contribution to public life and to mourn his death—but not be defeated by the hatred that killed him.

He died a witness to his belief in the theological virtues of faith, hope and charity and to their practical realisation, including in working for others until the very end. He did his duty to his God, his family, his constituency and his country. What truer passport is there to eternal life?"

And what a positive example to the church as we seek to work together with difference. Please do continue to hold the Amess family in your thoughts and prayers.

As we remember the family of Sir David, we think of others within the Benefice who are in the midst of grief and suffering at this time and extend our love and prayers to them. Next Sunday, 31st October, we will be holding our annual Commemoration of the Departed Service. It will be at Bulphan Church at 4pm. Everyone is welcome to attend; there is no need to be invited or to book a place. If you wish to have a loved one remembered at this service then please write their name clearly on one of the sheets at the back of church or let me know, by phone or email. All names will be read out at the service and there will also be an opportunity to light a candle in memory of the life of the person you wish to commemorate.

Also, just to let you know that Saturday 6th November will be our first anniversary of Forest Church in the Benefice so we will be celebrating with a Birthday Cake. Do join us if you are able, at Bulphan Churchyard, at 4pm on that day.

And finally, don't forget that next Saturday evening we put the clocks back.



If you have any old or foreign currency to donate we would be very grateful.




