Each year on the fourth Sunday of Lent, countries around the world celebrate Mothering Sunday. Churches celebrate by giving thanks to the women who have nurtured us throughout our lives. The church recognises that the day may be difficult for some people and so services may include prayers for those who don't find the day particularly easy. In some churches flowers are blessed and handed out during the main service.

Here are some of the traditions that have shaped Mothering Sunday into the celebration recognised today:

The Journey to the Mother Church

In the 16th century, people would make a journey to their 'mother' church once a year. This might have been their home church, their nearest cathedral or a major parish church in a bigger town. The service which took place at the 'mother' church symbolised the coming together of families.

A day off to visit Mother

Another tradition was to allow those working in the fields on wealthy farms and estates in England to have the day off on the fourth Sunday of Lent to visit their mothers and possibly go to church too. This was a variation on the theme of visiting the 'mother' church and was a move towards a more family focussed occasion.
