

The highlight for me was on the Thursday evening at 9.45pm when Bulphan's new fantastic beacon was lit by David Hale. When passing through village hall with its amazing historic display you were met with a great sea of people who had come to witness the lighting. Rector Sue gave an address and Bulphan's very own piper Joanne Goddard played so wonderfully. Earlier, Town Crier Steve Benn had proclaimed for the Queen. There was also an afternoon tea, quiz night, many local individual celebrations, bunting and Union Jacks everywhere, live music which all added to the atmosphere of jubilation.

At the Sunday morning service at St Marys Church, Bulphan, Rector Sue planted a Birch tree at a place near the front of the Church for all to remember the remarkable Jubilee celebrations.

As most people know, after forty years of dedicated service Ron Porter stood down as Churchwarden. We thank Ron who has caried out hard and dedicated work over such a long period.

For me only having arrived about thirty-five years ago it was always Ron and someone, fortunately he still remains as our PCC Secretary and I am thankful that I can always refer to him being so knowledgeable in all aspects of Church life.

Forty years ago the Church was not in such a great condition as it is now, during that period Ron was instrumental in the major refurbishment of the Church during 1998. At one stage with the flooring removed and the roof open to the elements it did look in a sorry state.

Then there was the Millennium project of the new Parish Room which has added so much to the life of the Church.

We all wish Ron and Traudi well.

BULPHAN-IN-BLOOM

Despite the Covid restrictions imposed during the past two years, Bulphan-in-Bloom were able to achieve a number of objectives during 2021, and as conditions improved and lockdown rules eased into 2022, these are some of the highlights our team of volunteers carried out:

A memorial bench for the late Ron Smith, (a dedicated team member), was purchased and a plague fitted and will be sited near the Lavender beds on the East side of the A128, also a tree has been planted in Ron's memory.

Many of the wooden planter barrels had become rotten and these have been replaced with new. Last year a thousand primula were planted and these have now been replaced with a thousand Geraniums at various locations around the village, plus perennial planting in three large containers in the churchyard.

The Willow dome in the recreation ground has now been brought under control, re-weaving and shaping it into a proper dome. Mowing and strimming at the entrance to the village, the village hall and churchyard have also been regular and routine tasks. The leaning cast iron lamppost in front of the church has been repainted, composting bins installed, monthly litter-picking, weeding and maintaining the Lavender beds, pruning and monthly tidy-ups. We have been busy!



Update from Orsett C of E Primary School



It's been a while since I wrote my last update – lots has been happening at Orsett and we've continued to make great memories with the children.

Jubilee Fun

Last month, alongside many of you we celebrated the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. We had lots of fun in school, organising different activities for the children to carousel around. They made flags, crowns and designed their own stamps among many other things. We made cards to send to the Queen too – we hope she replies! We also had a Bake-off competition with lots of Jubilee themed cakes which we sold making over £300! Check out the Corgi Cake below which was one of our 9 winners! We finished the week with a community picnic which was the first time our parents have been able to join us for event in over two years. Unfortunately, it didn't quite go to plan as the heavens opened so we had to picnic indoors! We loved the spirit of the occasion however and the rain stopped for enough time for us to sing the national anthem together outside on the playground. We hope you enjoyed your activities whatever you did!





We have also had a maths workshop in school which helped the children to develop their reasoning and problem solving skills. It was great fun and a wonderful way to get out of the classroom and experience maths in a completely different way. All children took part from reception right up to Year 6.

There were activities in the morning as well as races in the afternoon. It was just lovely to have everyone together. We even managed another community picnic and this time it didn't rain! Now we can meet together it is making us feel like one big family again. Whilst we've always known this it helps to be able to celebrate together and be the great community we know we are! I very much hope to see this continue for the rest of this year and many more to come.



It won us a prize in the village bunting competition!


