Rector's Reflections

Following the sad death of Queen Elizabeth II, I would like to thank everyone who has worked hard, to ring the bells and to open the churches for people to come and say prayers, light a candle or sign a book of condolence.

During the period of mourning, we held services of prayer and thanksgiving for the life of the Queen during which, together, we considered,

- What stands out in our memories about The Queen?
- What we will always remember about her?
- What we learned through her life and death, including about God in Jesus Christ?

I reflected that the things for me that most stand out and which I will always remember about Queen Elizabeth II are her loyalty, her servanthood and her faith.

We have all heard those words which she spoke on her 21st Birthday, when she said:

'I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family, to which we all belong.'

She honoured that commitment until her dying day. And people respect her for that; for her integrity and loyalty.

Queen Elizabeth was a Christian. And I believe that her reign was a success because it was underpinned by her deep faith in God. She knew who was Lord of her life, who was sovereign and ruler of all. She knew who to thank, who to turn to for guidance and who was her strength when things got tough.

It was so moving to see the thousands of people drawn to London to pay their respects and lay flowers, after which they returned home to continue with their everyday lives and the Royal family were afforded some space to grieve in private.

Of course, most of the beautiful floral tributes will have, by now, withered but memories of the much-loved Queen will live on and be passed down through the generations. It is my prayer that through the Queen's life and death, people will be pointed to the one under whom she served and the one who reigns over all, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. Because Jesus Christ, lives on for eternity and is there for each one of us, just as he was for the Queen and will be for King Charles and future monarchs. He is there for all, whatever our personal circumstances or social class.

The Queen unfailingly honoured her commitment to devote her whole life to the service of her people. When we become Christians, we make a commitment to follow Jesus Christ, the greatest servant of all, and it is certainly my prayer that my commitment to Jesus Christ will be as honourable as her late Majesty's was to God and to us.

Bulphan Churchwarden's Report

Each day we are witnessing history unfold before us, events are taking place that will be studied and remembered by future generations.

The passing of our gracious and wonderful Queen Elizabeth II on Thursday, 8th September 2022 has left

most people saddened but thankful for the 70 years' service that she gave. And the immediate transfer of the crown to her son, now King Charles III, brings continuity and hope for the future.

There have been so many tributes to Her Majesty that there's not much that I can contribute, as someone said words are not enough.

My own recollections from this time were at the age of 8, we travelled from Forest Gate to Jupp Road, Stratford to watch the Coronation of the Queen on my Aunty Ivy's and Uncles Fred's 11" square black and white tv, which stood like a large shoe box in the corner of the room. I remember the sort of grey picture on the television. Shortly after, all the East London streets had their infamous street parties and from a photograph I was dressed as a pirate and my two sisters in crepe paper dressed as flower girls.

In 1984 the Charted Institute of Building celebrated its 150 years' centenary at which Queen Elizabeth II and the Duke of Edinburgh were to be present. We sent off and received two tickets to go to St James Palace. When we arrived I remember the Eastern Area Secretary saying to me, how did you get here? It seems that there was a raffle for the tickets and we were very lucky to get them.

Whilst we were not introduced to the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh, we were within touching distance of them and had already been informed of the protocol, we didn't realise until then how small and beautiful the Queen was. Visiting St James Palace and meeting the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh was truly a memorable occasion.

The first Saturday in September marked the return of the Orsett Show, the first since 2019. The Deanery had a "tent" in which members of the Clergy and congregations from across the borough came together to promote the work of the Church. We had a series of free activities for children; glitter tattoos, plate painting, biscuit decorating and picture colouring. The café was busy through the day with tea, coffee and biscuits on offer, along with apples being given away. Many thanks to all of those who loaned equipment and helped in any capacity to make the day successful, and, a special thanks to Frank Woollard and his team for their efforts driving across the borough to collect and drop off much of equipment to make this possible.

On that day it was impossible to imagine that 5 days later at 6.30pm on Thursday 8th September we would be coming to terms with the announcement of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. A moment that has been difficult to comprehend, as with a reign over 70 years she was the only Monarch many have known. She touched the lives of everyone and her boundless energy was quite remarkable. Bulphan Church Porch Appeal



As the surrounding soil is affected by seasonal changes (shrinkage in the summer and heave in winter), the structure responds and has causing extensive cracks in the stonework, deformity in the floor and movement in the outer doors, to the point where occasionally the bolts have to be repositioned.

One important thing that the charity asks that we use regular size shoeboxes to make packing in their lorries easier. If you don't have a printer at home there are some leaflets in each Church and School.

If you would like to take part in this appeal the deadline to take filled shoeboxes into your Church or School is <u>Wednesday 2nd November</u>.

There are two options

The Family Shoeboxes of gifts are given to families who often have to make a choice between buying food or fuel at Christmas time – buying presents is just not a priority. Many of these families do not have running water, heating or electricity. Some live in appalling conditions, often living in just one or two rooms, and life for them is a real struggle to survive. A shoebox for a family that everyone receives a gift. A scarf for the mum, a tape measure for the dad, toys and games for the children as well as stationery and coloured pens. Also toiletries, toothpaste, shampoo and soap to keep everyone clean and free from the germs that make them ill. And of course sweets and chocolates for everyone – a family favourite.

Due to the number of elderly people that are now being left alone due to their families leaving to work away, they have launched the **Elderly Shoebox Appeal**. The boxes are similar however the children's games and education materials are replaced with a wind up torch, sensory items, candle and holder etc.

Boxes get sent to **Romania, Bulgaria, Moldova and Ukraine.** The charity is small enough that they have a personal relationship with all the key contacts in Eastern Europe who distribute your Shoeboxes and we do spot checks to ensure that your boxes are received by the correct people. Ink to Hope is **Christian charity** who believe in distributing love to those in need regardless of background, colour, creed or religion.



Chelmsford Diocese Mothers' Union (CDMU)



Like many across the world, Mothers' Union members have been reflecting on the life and death of Queen Elizabeth II. She was a passionate supporter and patron of Mothers' Union for 70 years. Through these decades, her invaluable encouragement and dedication towards our cause has been an indispensable part of all we have achieved.

Reading the book "The Servant Queen and the King she serves", produced for the Queen's 90th birthday, we were struck by the similarities between how the Queen and Mary Sumner, the founder of Mothers' Union, lived their lives and shared their beliefs.

- In 1992 the Queen said: "I know just how much I rely on my faith to guide through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel".
 - One of Mary Sumner's most enduring phrases must be 'set a good example in word and deed'. Members today follow her example in the way she went about her life.
- In 1975, the Queen said of Jesus: "His simple message of love has been turning the world upside down ever since. He showed that what people are and what they do, does matter and does make all the difference..... A big stone can cause waves, but even the smallest pebble changes the whole pattern of the water. Our daily actions are like those ripples, each one makes a difference, even the smallest And the combined effect can be enormous. If enough grains of sand are dropped into one side of a pair of scales they will, in the end, tip it against a lump of lead."
 - As a powerful example of advocacy in the name of the Lord, Mary Sumner's life shows us that we can each make a difference. Her personal prayer also demonstrated this: All this day, O Lord, let me touch as many lives as possible for thee; and every life I touch, do thou by thy spirit quicken, whether through the word I speak, the prayer I breathe, or the life I live. Amen
- At Christmas 2015, she said: "Despite being displaced and persecuted throughout his short life, Christ's unchanging message was not one of revenge or violence but simply that we should love one another."
 - Mary Sumner herself had a vision of a fellowship of women supporting each other and strengthening their communities. This community emphasis can be seen in full force today as members tackle some of the most challenging issues that they and their neighbours face.

An extract from the tribute to the Queen by Sheran Harper, MU Worldwide President:

"We give thanks to God for Queen Elizabeth II being our Patron, for blessing her with special gifts for a life humbly dedicated to public service, her strong faith as she weathered many storms; her commitment and devotion to family life; and her great concern for communities and all people.

Her guidance and support of Mothers' Union over the decades has enabled us to achieve so much in impacting communities and touching lives. During times of ongoing war and turmoil around the world, she reminded us of the healing power of forgiveness, peace and reconciliation. This inspired us and encouraged us to work for harmony and good relationships among all people in our communities.

Her spirit of acceptance to change and transformation through the years and her ability to take others on the journey of change is testimony to her great strength as a leader and her faith in change that is inevitable. This outlook on life strengthened Mothers' Union members to embrace all opportunities of change and transformation that truly reflect the worldwide nature of our movement.

We will always remember her intelligence and humility in making wise decisions, her charm and sense of humour, and her sincere caring and gentleness. Hers was a life born to serve God and all humanity and her legacy that will live on in so many ways and in the hearts of all Mothers' Union members for generations to come."





FAMOUS PERSON IN OCTOBER

TERENCE CONRAN 1931-2020



Terence Conran, in full Sir Terence Orby Conran, (born October 4, 1931, Kingston upon Thames, Surrey, England—died September 12, 2020, Kintbury, Berkshire), English designer, restaurateur, and businessman credited with making stylish housewares and home décor available to a wider market beginning in the 1960s.


Conran attended the Central School of Arts and Crafts (now a college at Central Saint Martins University of the Arts), where he studied textile design. He established a furniture studio while still a student, sharing the space with one of his professors, artist Eduardo Paolozzi. In 1950 Conran left school to work for an architect, whom he assisted in planning structures used for the 1951 Festival of Britain. He opened a furniture workshop, Conran and Company, in London's Notting Hill neighbourhood in 1952. Impressed by Gallic cuisine during a sojourn in France that year, Conran, along with several friends, opened a French-

inspired restaurant in London in 1953; it was followed by a coffee shop in 1954. In 1956 he formed the Conran Design Group, which, in addition to subsuming his furniture business, designed interiors and retail spaces. Among the nascent atelier's early efforts was a shop design for fashion designer Mary Quant. Though Conran made much of his early furniture by hand, by 1963 he had moved operations to a large factory in Norfolk, England.

In 1964 Conran opened Habitat, a store selling his furniture as well as a range of then-obscure housewares such as woks, in London's Chelsea neighbourhood. Conran's innovative "flat-packaging"—which required the purchaser to assemble the furniture at home—allowed for substantially lower pricing. This accessibility, combined with the elegant and utilitarian Bauhaus ethos of the products, particularly appealed to young working people to whom artful design had been previously unavailable (such luxuries being considered the preserve of the wealthy). Conran opened a succession of Habitat outlets in London, and by 1970 the retailer had merged with a stationery company, which gained controlling stock. By 1977 the chain had expanded to the United States—where it was known as the Conran Shop because of trademark conflicts. Conran reacquired Habitat in 1980, and in 1981 he took the company public. A year later it expanded again to include Mothercare, a retailer of maternity and infant products. In 1986 Conran folded those stores, along with British Home Stores and several clothing chains, into the conglomerate Storehouse, for which he served as CEO and chairman. Following the poor performance of the unwieldy holding company, investors ousted him as CEO in 1988, and he stepped down as chairman in 1990. Habitat, of which he had again lost ownership, was sold in 1992 to the Ikano Group, a Swedish company that also owned the mass-market IKEA housewares chain.

Conran, however, maintained some of his business interests under Conran Holdings, established in 1990. Among them was his growing restaurant business, established as Conran Restaurants (later called D&D London) in 1991, which oversaw a variety of eateries in London as well as internationally, and his architectural design firm (founded 1982). The latter, which became Conran & Partners in 1999 following a merger, designed portions of the massive Roppongi Hills development in Toyko (2003). Conran also managed to salvage the Conran Shop from Storehouse, buying back the retailer and erecting outposts in France, Japan, and the United States. The retail magnate maintained a separate custom-furniture imprint, Benchmark, founded in 1984.

Conran was the author of numerous books on design- and food-related topics, among them *The House Book* (1974), *Terence Conran's Home Furnishings* (1986), *Terence Conran on Restaurants* (2000), and *Terence Conran's Inspiration* (2008; co-written with Stafford Cliff). He established Boilerhouse, an exhibition space at the Victoria and Albert Museum intended to showcase the intersection of form and function in industrial design. Boilerhouse opened in 1981 and evolved into the Design Museum, which moved to a converted warehouse in London in 1989 and then to a larger, state-of-the-art building in 2016. Conran was knighted in 1983.


