Dear Everyone,

Our Christmas services began last Sunday evening in The Foxhound Pub, Orsett, when we gathered together for Barrels and Carols. We had a lovely time, even if we were competing with England playing Senegal in the World Cup! The good thing, though, was that our carols and readings were punctuated with cheering each time England scored. Thank you, so much, to Bradley the landlord, who allowed us to do this. There will also be carols in The Swan, Horndon on the Hill, on the evening of Sunday 23rd December at 7pm, so if you missed the event in the Foxhound, do pop along to Horndon.

I listened to Moneybox Live on Radio 4 this week, when they were discussing the fact that that, due to the increased cost of living, Christmas this year won't be as extravagant or luxurious as it often is for many. People shared ideas as to how to make Christmas special without spending a lot of money. Perhaps this situation provides all of us with an opportunity to remind ourselves of the true meaning of Christmas, away from material distractions, a prompt that it is time to celebrate God who came down to earth in great love, as a human, born not in the main inn but in a shed out the back.

And, of course, Jesus' parents were refugees, having to flee from Bethlehem to Egypt for fear of Herod who intended to kill all babies under the age of two in the hope of killing Jesus, whom he regarded as a threat. There are so many parallels with the story of Jesus and the hardship many in our world are suffering at this time, including those who are having to flee their own countries in search of safety.

So, as we prepare ourselves for Christmas, this Advent, let us reflect on who Jesus was; God who came down in love, not luxury, to walk alongside each and everyone, not just in their joys but in their struggles, and let us also remind ourselves that he is a God who continues to do that now.

This year, the Church of England has produced some resources entitled 'Follow the Star-The Great Invitation.' These are reflections and prayers on the theme of invitation from Christmas Eve through to Epiphany on 6th January 2023. You can obtain this resource online by downloading the app or there are some paper copies available to purchase for 70p each. These will be available at the back of all three churches and at the Christmas Bazaar at Bulphan, this Saturday between 12 and 3.30pm. There are also a few large print copies for those who would appreciate one of these.


Your continued support for this charity is much appreciated. The Parish has 5 collection boxes as listed below:
