Dear Everyone,

We are approaching Lent when we remember Jesus in the wilderness, in preparation for his earthly ministry. It is a good time for us all to refocus on God and to consider our priorities. The church will be offering several opportunities to help us to do this.

Lent will begin with an Ash Wednesday Service on Wednesday 22nd February at 7.30pm at St Peter and St Paul's Church, Horndon on the Hill. There will also be a Lent Course on Monday evenings from 8pm until 9pm at the Rectory. Please let me know if you are interested in coming.

You can also sign up to receive daily Lent Reflections from a Church of England Resource entitled 'Dust and Glory' These take us on a Lent journey of faith, failure and forgiveness and are intended to help us to find God in the mess of every day life. You can find details of how to sign up to these reflections on page 3 of the notices. I will be ordering a few paper copies for those who don't have access to electronic devices. Please let me know if you would like one.

Also, the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book this year is entitled Failure: What Jesus said about sin, mistakes and messing stuff up by Emma Ineson. One of the parishioners has kindly given me a copy of this book as she has found it helpful and I am looking forward to reading it. It is produced by SPCK and the ISBN Number, should you wish to order yourself a copy is 978-0-281-08784-6. Or you can get it as an e-book, with ISBN: 978-0-281-08785-3. During Lent, the churches together in Horndon, Orsett and Bulphan will be hosting the annual World Day of Prayer service on Friday 3rd March at St Giles and All Saints Church, Orsett at 12 noon (changed from 11am as shown in Hobnob magazine).

And, also during Lent there will be a Lent Lunch every Saturday at 12.00 where we will share a simple lunch. There is no charge for this but people will be asked to make a donation to the Great Green Wall, a tree planting initiative in Africa. The first of these will be at Horndon Church on Saturday 25th February and the pattern will be HOB, Horndon, Orsett, Bulphan....., there will be actual dates in next week's notice sheet.

This Sunday we are also having a Refresh Service, 4pm at Horndon Church and everyone is Welcome. It is an informal, contemporary service using a screen and modern worship songs. The service lasts approximately an hour and is followed by refreshments.



The exact date of Shrove Tuesday changes from year to year and typically falls between 3rd February and 9th March. This year Shrove Tuesday is on 21st February and is followed, the next day, by Ash Wednesday.

What is Shrove Tuesday?

Shrove Tuesday is a feast day to celebrate indulgence before a period of fasting during the Christian season of Lent, the 40-day period before Easter Sunday.

Why do we eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday?

Shrove Tuesday provides an opportunity to use up eggs and fats before Lent – during which eggs, fats, dairy and meat were traditionally given up – making pancakes a great recipe choice.

What Is Ash Wednesday?

Each year, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration. The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year marking an intentional season of focus on following Christ.

In many congregations, the ashes are prepared by burning palm branches from the previous Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday, churches bless and hand out palm branches to attendees, referencing the Gospels' account of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, when onlookers laid palm branches on his path.

The ashes of this holiday symbolize two main things: death and repentance. "Ashes are equivalent to dust, and human flesh is composed of dust or clay (Genesis 2:7), and when a human corpse decomposes, it returns to dust or ash."

With this focus on our own mortality and sinfulness, Christians can enter into the Lent season solemnly while also looking forward in greater anticipation and joy to the message of Easter and Christ's ultimate victory over sin and death.

This is becoming more popular and John Lewis has just launched their own clothing rental department.




Dust and Glory encourages us to take a fresh look at the frustrations and failings that every day brings, seek to learn from them and grow closer to God through them.
