Rector's Reflections

December has come round once again, and Advent has begun. There are many ways that we can all prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus. And I would, at this point, like to say a huge thank you to everyone who has enabled church events to happen smoothly throughout the year and to those who are working hard to make this Christmas special. You can find details of our Christmas services further on in the magazine and I look forward to seeing you at some of them.

I am very conscious, however, as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, that many of our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land are facing a very different reality from the one that we are living and we all long for a time of peace. I am, indeed, praying for a ceasefire. We sing 'O Little town of Bethlehem how still we see thee lie.' Yet how far from the current truth can this be?

Thousands of people have been killed and over a million displaced after the escalation of violence in Israel and the occupied Palestinian territory.

1,400 Israelis have been killed and 5,400 injured. Israeli civilians, including women and children, have been forcibly taken.

In Gaza, 10,818 Palestinians have been killed and 26,905 have been injured. Airstrikes have caused widespread destruction of homes, schools, healthcare facilities and telecommunication installations. Hospitals already at breaking point have been destroyed, and over a million people have been displaced. Food supplies, fuel supplies, access to water and sanitation, and schools have been drastically affected. So, as we make our preparations for Christmas, let's not grumble because we don't get our favourite carol, but be thankful for the freedom we have, to celebrate in the way that we do. Moreover, let's be mindful of those in parts of the world where the fact that they are alive today is a gift they can't take for granted tomorrow.

Please do especially keep the people of the Holy Land in your prayers.

The Church opens on Monday and Thursday mornings for private prayer and there is a service held on every third Sunday. The Holy Communion Service on a Tuesday evening has been transferred to the Rectory. This is mainly due to the low attendance and the fact that during the cold dark winter nights the Rectory might prove a better venue.

There are changes within the Chelmsford Diocese. The Bradwell Episcopal area which consists of eight Deaneries, one of which is Thurrock has a new Bishop of Bradwell, Adam Atkinson who took office in November 2023; I attended his Ordination and Consecration at Westminster Abbey on Friday, 29th September 2023.

Within our own Church we have had an amazing Remembrance Service, our thanks go to 'Brassy' Steve, Piper Joe and Janet McCheyne for their musical skills. With the current wars raging in Ukraine and Gaza people seemed very aware of the debt that is owed to those who laid down their lives for our freedom.

Phil Anderson in his recent address, reminded us that there are thirty- two countries where conflicts are being fought.

Our thanks go out to all the Bulphan in Bloomers who this weekend carried out such an amazing cleanup in the Churchyard. We have just received approval from the Probation Service that they will recommence their grass cutting/strimming works within the churchyard, which hopefully will remove some of the burden from Bulphan in Bloom. These works stopped during the Covid Pandemic.

During the past month the fire extinguishers were tested and recharged/replaced where necessary.



Lemon Tarts

8 oz shortcrust pastry	2 oz breadcrumbs
2 oz margarine or butter	1 egg
2 oz caster sugar	Juice of 1 lemon

Roll out shortcrust pastry and cut into twelve rounds. Beat together margarine, sugar, and egg. Add breadcrumbs and lemon juice. Mix well. Divide between the pastry cases and bake at Gas Mark 4 (180 C) for 15-20 minutes, until filling is set.

CALL FOR PEACE & HUMANITY

On 11.11.23, with the support and prayers of the Ecology & Social Justice Action Group, I took part in the London march calling for a ceasefire in Gaza. This was the biggest propeace protest since weekly marches began, attended by more than 300,000 people – including individuals, families with children, young & old, Christians, Muslims & Jews. I have never before taken part in such a protest but my Christian, moral and ethical conscience would not allow me to be silent on this matter.

Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy. Proverbs 31:8-9

Wearing my poppy, on Armistice Day, it seemed appropriate to be marching for peace. The Oxford English Dictionary definition of **Armistice is 'a suspension of hostilities**; a truce, a **ceasefire**; ...'. I was exercising the very rights and freedoms that many sacrificed their lives for and for whom I observed silence the following day, Remembrance Sunday. The march was over a mile away from the Cenotaph observance, later in the day, and the day before the main Remembrance Day Service and Parade; important distinctions overlooked by some.

I am no expert in the circa 75 year and complex Israel Palestine conflict but for the last 15 years I have informed myself about the plight of the Palestinian people. I have attended talks by both Palestinians and Israelis and heard about the illegal settlements, demolitions and clearances of Palestinians from their lands; the apartheid practiced by Israel in Jerusalem and the West Bank, the control exercised over Palestinian water, fuel and food supplies – all documented by the United Nations and Israeli & international human rights organisations.

Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Philippians 2:4

The Hamas attack on Israel on 7 October 2023 was horrific and must be condemned. But since then, UN figures show that over 9,000 (and rising) Palestinian civilians have been killed in Gaza; approximately 1,200 Israelis have been killed in the same period. This disproportionate and indiscriminate killing of civilians and the collective punishment of Gazans by withholding fuel, food and water, is why I felt I had to add my presence to the call for a ceasefire, in addition to letters to MPs & Ministers. I ask myself, if a gunman took refuge in a house in my street, would I not find it unacceptable for the authorities to isolate me and my neighbours, cut off our food, water and power, and destroy our homes and occupants, in order to eliminate the criminal?

Whoever shuts their ears to the cry of the poor will also cry out and not be answered. Proverbs 21:13

The march was noisy but peaceful. I witnessed no intimidation or violence. I felt safe. The chants called for ceasefire, justice and peace. Surely, we can no longer watch more innocent civilians die; peace and security to Palestinians and Israel will only prevail when the bombing and oppression stops. Opposing Israeli government policy is not antisemitic. I pray for PEACE for <u>all</u>.



Five Candles

We are now in the season known as Advent, the 4 weeks in the Christian calendar that mark approach of Jesus' birth. This year Advent starts on Sunday December 3rd and finishes on Sunday 24th December, Christmas Eve.

A tradition of the wreath has its origin in 15th century Germany and marked the approach of Christmas more than Advent. Originally Advent, like Easter, lasted 40 days, starting on November 11th with the Feast of Martinmas.



During the period known as Advent when you visit church you will see a wreath of evergreen leaves which represents eternity, with 3 purple and one pink candle around the outside, and a white candle in the middle, this is the Advent Wreath. Each candle represents an aspect of the spiritual preparation for the coming of Jesus. We light a candle on the Sunday of each of the four weeks, culminating with the white candle.

The candles have symbolism and meaning:

Candle 1 (purple) :	The Patriarchs – typically Abraham, his son Isaac, and
	Isaac's son Jacob, also named Israel, the ancestor of

Candle 2 (purple) :	The Prophets – who foretold the coming of the Messiah
	including Isaiah and Zechariah. There are many
	Prophets.
Candle 3 (pink) :	John the Baptist – Jesus' cousin who proclaimed the
	Saviour
Candle 4 (purple) :	The Virgin Mary – who gave birth to Jesus
Christmas Day candle (white) :	The Christ candle signifying the birth of Jesus, light of
, , , ,	the world

In this definition each of the four Advent Sundays reminds us of those who prepared for Jesus' coming.

Another meaning for the candles is;

Candle	1	(purp	le)	:

Hope (in the one to come) Candle 2 (purple) : Peace (in the world)

- Candle 3 (pink) : Joy (in the waiting for the time we can all feel joy)
- Candle 4 (purple) : Love (the love of God who sent his only son) Christmas Day candle (white) : The Christ (the light of the world)

In this definition each of the four Advent Sundays reminds us of what we should feel each week.

The White candle can be lit on Christmas Eve. Although strictly it should be lit on Christmas Day and then at services after this, until the end of the Christmas season which is another much debated topic.

Throughout Advent the themes of the services should reflect the candle being lit. What seems to causes confusion is the pink candle, as despite what may be seen as a convention for pink to symbolise females, it does not symbolise or represent Mary.

FAMOUS PERSON IN DECEMBER

JOHN MILTON

December 9th 1608 – November 8th 1674

An English poet, pamphleteer, and historian, considered the most significant English author after William Shakespeare.

John Milton was a formidable English writer of the 17th Century and great believer in liberty. He was born in Bread Street, London on 9th December 1608. His father also named John was a scrivener (one who wrote contracts and other legal documents). His mother was named Sarah. John Milton senior also composed music and from an early age, John Milton Junior also loved music. Aged 12, he attended St Paul's school.



In 1625 Milton went to Cambridge University, he was awarded a BA in 1629 and an MA in 1632. After leaving university Milton continued studying at home. He also wrote poetry and in 1629 wrote a poem called "On the Morning of Christ's Nativity". In 1634 a masque by John Milton called Comus was performed; a masque was a form of entertainment that involved, drama, music, and dance. In 1638 his famous poem called Lycidas was published.

During 1638-39, Milton travelled to France and Italy and met Galileo. In 1639 when he returned to England he became a schoolteacher in London.

In 1642 civil war began between the King Charles I and parliament. John Milton was a strong supporter of freedom so chose to support the parliamentarians. In 1642 he wrote pamphlets attacking episcopacy (church government by bishops), and the following year wrote a pamphlet arguing that divorce should be allowed and then in 1644 he wrote a pamphlet in favour of freedom of speech. Following the execution of King Charles I in 1649 John Milton wrote material supporting the Commonwealth (the republican government that ruled from 1649 to 1660). During this period, Milton worked for the government translating documents into Latin.

Tragically in 1652, Milton went blind. However, in 1667 his great work Paradise Lost was first printed. It deals with the rebellion of Adam and Eve against God and their expulsion from the Garden of Eden. In 1671 another work by Milton, Paradise Regained was published. John Milton was married 3 times. He died on 8 November 1674 aged 65 and is buried in St Giles Church in Cripplegate, London.

Today he is remembered as the greatest English writer of the 17th century.
