### Today's Collect

Holy God, you know the disorder of our sinful lives: set straight our crooked hearts, and bend our wills to love your goodness and your glory in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Dear Everyone,

As I write this, I am watching the snow falling outside. I hope you are all managing to stay warm!

Last Sunday we were thinking of Christ as a light in the darkness and together we reflected on John 1:1-14 and shared a meditation from the Iona Community with the theme 'With God all things are possible.'

There are many dark things happening in the world at the moment and one of the issues we reflected on at the weekend was the current situation in Myanmar which hit headlines on 1st February, when its military seized control and the country's leader, Aung San Suu Kyi, and members of her party, were detained. The threat this has posed to those living in Myanmar has resulted in the banging of saucepans, not in applause as we know it, but in protest brought about by desperation. This kind of situation is unknown to most of us but the people in Myanmar are greatly in need of our prayers at this time and, especially our Christian brothers and sisters who are living in fear.

On another global matter, it was great to hear on Sunday that several people are interested in participating in our Zoom Lent Course, 'For such a time as this' which explores ecological justice. Please do let me know if you would like to join in with this. It will be on Thursday evenings at 8pm, beginning on February 18th. If you are unable to access Zoom but would like me to order you the course book to use for your own reflection and prayer at home, I am very happy to do this. Just let me know.

On Ash Wednesday, there will be a service on Zoom at 7.30pm. I was trying to think of the best way of providing people with ash but I think the best suggestion is that you make your own. What you need to do is find an old palm cross at home, burn it to make ash and then add some olive oil to the ash and you will be ready.

As always, please do let me know of any prayer and pastoral needs.



# World Day of Prayer 2021

This year's Benefice World Day of Prayer Service is going to be held in October, instead of March, because we do not know when lockdown will allow us to get together. It will be in Horndon Church.

The service for 2021 is written by the Christians of Vanuatu, which is an archipelago of 80 islands in the Pacific 2000 miles east of Australia. Their theme is "Build on a Strong Foundation." Please look at the World Day of Prayer website where there is a short film about Vanuatu, see:-

## Individual Private Prayer



All churches are closed for private prayer for the foreseeable future but please let Revd Sue or Revd Max know if you have any prayer or pastoral needs



Donations made through this scheme use a Direct Debit. If you are a tax payee and you give permission, PGS can reclaim the Gift Aid for your church. It is also easy to protect your donation from inflation if you choose; they will calculate the difference and notify you each year in advance, to ask if you are happy to increase your gift by the cost of living.

There are three easy ways to donate to your church through the Parish Giving Scheme. You can

- set up your Direct Debit online at [www.parishgiving.org.uk](http://www.parishgiving.org.uk)
- call the Parish Giving team and they will take you through it, step by step. Their telephone service is on 0333 002 1271, Monday to Friday, 9am - 5pm, this will take about 15 minutes.
- Fill in a paper form, available from your Church's Treasurer.

If you decide to join this scheme you will be asked the PGS code for the church you are supporting, details below:

You will also need the following information to hand:

- Personal bank account details
- You will need to confirm if you want to increase your gift in line with inflation each year.
- Confirm if you are eligible for gift aid (i.e., a UK resident taxpayer)
